- 1.4 mile gravel trail. This is the main trail that starts across the street from the Sendero Springs Pool parking lot. Trail markers (▲)every 0.1 miles.
- 0.3 mile gravel trail. This trail starts at the Brushy Creek North Park and also hooks on to the main trail.
- 0.9 mile gravel trail that runs down the middle of the Great Oaks median.
- 0.8 mile gravel trail per loop. (Behrens Ranch Subdivision)
- **0.1** 0.2 mile trail extensions linking neighborhoods.

Trail system throughout Brushy Creek and the surrounding area





- 0.4 mile gravel trail. From Great Oaks Drive to the Creekside Trail.
 - 0.75 mile Fern Bluff MUD paved trail.
- 0.85 mile paved trail. From the corner of Great Oaks Drive along Hairyman Road.
- 6.0 mile gravel and paved trail. From the corner of Great Oaks Drive along Brushy Creek Road to Cedar Park. The trail is all paved from Brushy Creek Lake Park all the way to the Cedar Park YMCA.

Ephraim Trail

Total Distance 0.6 miles. This is an all gravel trail and begins and ends on Ephraim Road. At approximately 0.4 miles, the trail crosses Delavan Drive.



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Creekside Trail to Cedar Park

Total length: Approximately 7 miles from one end to the other end. This trail is a combination of the Brushy Creek trail system, Fern Bluff trail system, and the Williamson County Regional Trail system. This trail crosses over the Brushy Creek Lake Dam and ends at the Cedar Park YMCA.

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
